The children in the Lamb's room have been developing their visual skills, linked to their book with a hook 'Look'. The children enjoyed watching their own reflections in the mirrors, as they pat, reached and pointed to themselves. Staff mimicked their actions as they focused on the nursery rhyme, head, shoulders, knees and toes.

The Ducklings have been enjoying the' Going on a Lion Hunt' Story, the children enjoyed hearing new words and sounds as they learnt about the different things they would see in the African Savanna. The children enjoyed going on lion hunts and pretending to be lions as they crawled around the garden hunting for their prey.
